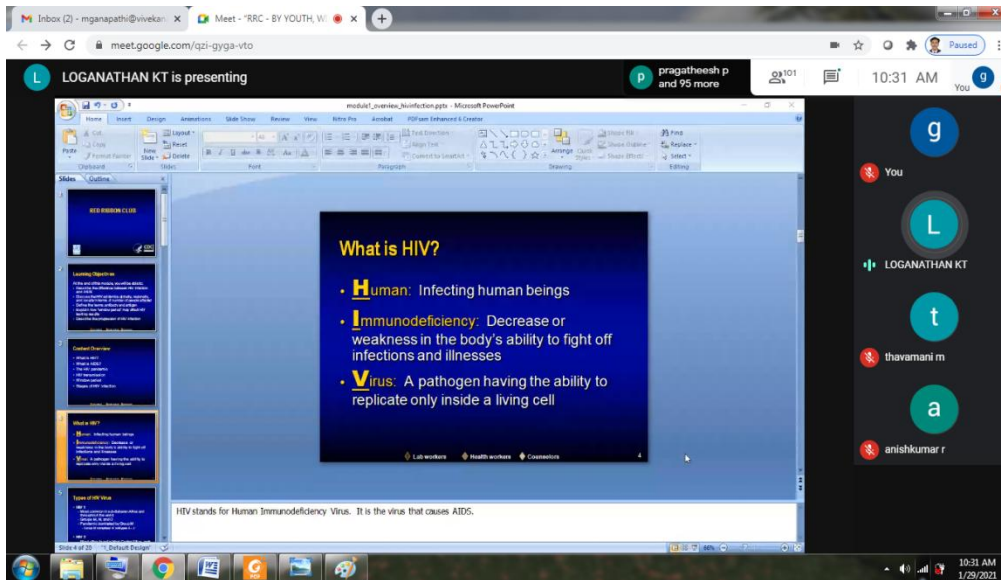
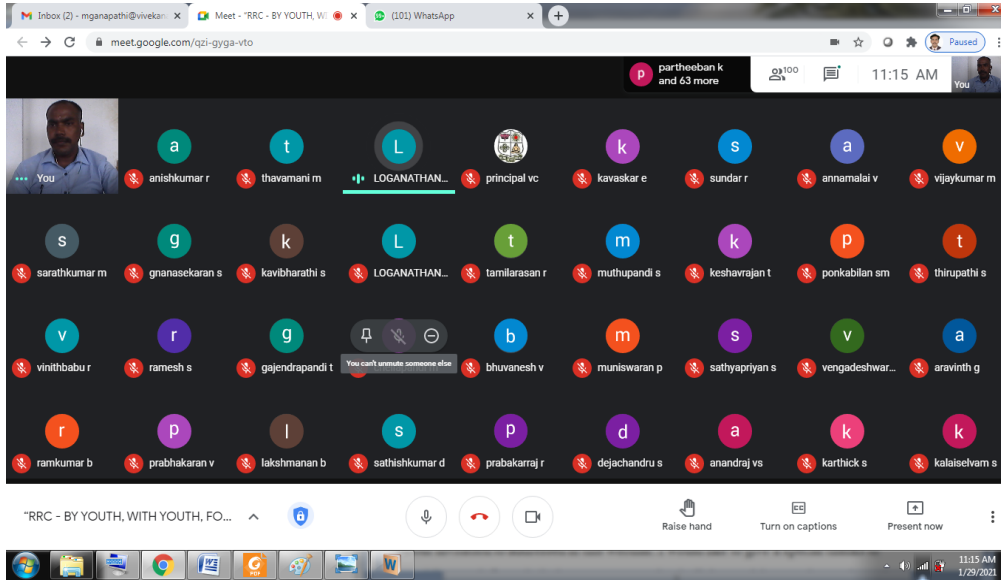
NATIONAL WEBINAR ON

Types of HIV Virus

- HIV 1
 - Most common in sub-Saharan Africa and throughout the world
 - Groups M, N, and O
 - Pandemic dominated by Group M
 - Group M comprised of subtypes A - J
- HIV 2
 - Most often found in West Central Africa, parts of Europe and India

Both produce the same pattern of illness. HIV2 causes a more slow progress of disease than those with HIV 1. It is important for tests to detect the HIV subtypes that are circulating in the region. Otherwise, test results lead to false negative results.
